Narrow Focus Smart Goal: All staff will use small group instruction (guide reading), co-created anchor charts/rubrics and explicit feedback/instruction (3 questions) so that 56% of students will move up one level and 44% of students will move within a level for reading for meaning as measured by May 31, 2010.

Strategies Used by Proficient Readers

A good reader is **metacognitive**—aware of and able to use and describe the following strategies in order to interact with the text (book).

- **1. Make Connections**. An active reader is able to draw from background knowledge and personal experiences while reading to help create meaning from the text (book).
- 2. Ask Questions. An active reader asks questions before, during and after reading to clarify and deepen understanding.
- 3. Visualize. An active reader is able to create multi-sensory images in the "mind's eye" while reading to help make sense of the text
- **4. Draw Inferences**. An active reader knows that not all information is included in a text, and is able to hypothesize and predict what is going to happen next, based on evidence in the text (book).
- **5. Determine Importance**. An active reader sifts through information in the text to select important ideas, choose what to remember, and set priorities.
- **6. Analyze and Synthesize**. An active reader is able to break down information and to draw conclusions based on both the text and his or her own thinking.
- **7. Monitor Comprehension**. An active reader is aware when understanding is being compromised and is able to stop, go back, and reread in order for understanding to occur.

(Based on the research of P. David Pearson)

Winter Clothing

Students do go outside for one 20 minute break and one 25 minute break every day. Students will go outside as long as there is not an extreme cold weather advisory or freezing rain. That is why it is important that everyone is dressed properly for the weather.

One of the problems that often comes with winter clothing is losing winter clothing. Please make sure that all of your child's winter clothing is labeled. This makes it much easier for us to help your child find missing articles. This also helps when there are children who have the same boots or coats, as we can help tell them apart.

Please make sure that your child has indoor shoes that they can leave at school. It is important to have these shoes at school everyday, as no child is allowed to go barefoot in the classroom, and therefore would be asked to wear their boots all day. This brings water into the classroom, which is a problem as we often will do activities that may require your child to sit on the floor. Please make sure your child's name is on their shoes as well.
